SERVICE MINISTRY

LWR Syria Campaign. Financial donations for the LWR Syria campaign will be accepted through the end of May. Donations can be made with cash or check to Immanuel (please write Syria in the memo line) or through a Stock donation to LWR. To date, almost \$5000 has been given towards this appeal which will help build bakeries in Aleppo, providing employment and bread. Immanuel's benevolence dollars regularly support the ongoing work of LWR as does the donation of 141 quilts by our Piecemakers and 89 Personal Care Kits donated during Lent. We are Called to Care and Sent to Serve through the development work of Lutheran World Relief.

PROP Summer Food Collection. Soon children will be out of school for the summer months. Families living on limited incomes who rely on the free and reduced school lunch program to feed their children will have the added financial burden of feeding their children at home. PROP helps families with extra kid-friendly food items during the summer months. Immanuel has agreed to provide 800 cans of tuna and 800 jars of peanut butter (regular sizes) to help PROP help our community. Your ongoing donations of food, paper and hygiene items are also still needed. Tuna and peanut butter can be placed in the red cart in the atrium. Please place other food items in the wooden collection bin outside of Fellowship Hall.

Housing Workshop. The City of Eden Prairie is in the midst of renewing their Comprehensive Plan through a campaign called "Aspire Eden Prairie 2040." These plans help to set goals for our community for the future. Community input is being sought about several issues including housing and transportation. A one-hour workshop on housing will be held at Immanuel on Monday, June 12 at 7 p.m. and will be facilitated by Kim Rathjen.
