Secretary's report: Tony moved to approve the August minutes as submitted, Bob seconded, the motion carried.

Portico Benefits package costs are increasing, considering increasing Darrell to full time, Clark's spouse will be added, and we will cover all the Erdmann's coverage in the future. Do we increase deductibles? Portico is the official insurance carrier for the ELCA. A comparison with similar plans was done by Paul Stordahl a couple of years ago; Portico was our best choice at that time. Employees pay 50% of the coverage for spouses and kids. We will reconsider our benefits package in 2019. What is the impact if we move from gold to silver coverage?

We discussed bereavement leave and the death of Paul Erdmann's wife Stephanie. Policy surrounding paid and unpaid leave in the employee guidebook was discussed.

The Boy Scouts hold their meetings here. We are a chartered organization of the Boy Scouts. The troop that meets here will discuss whether to accept girls into their troop. As their chartered organization, we are being asked for our guidance. Will we still welcome them as a charter partner if they allow girls into their troop? After some discussion, we agreed to support any change that is more inclusive.
