



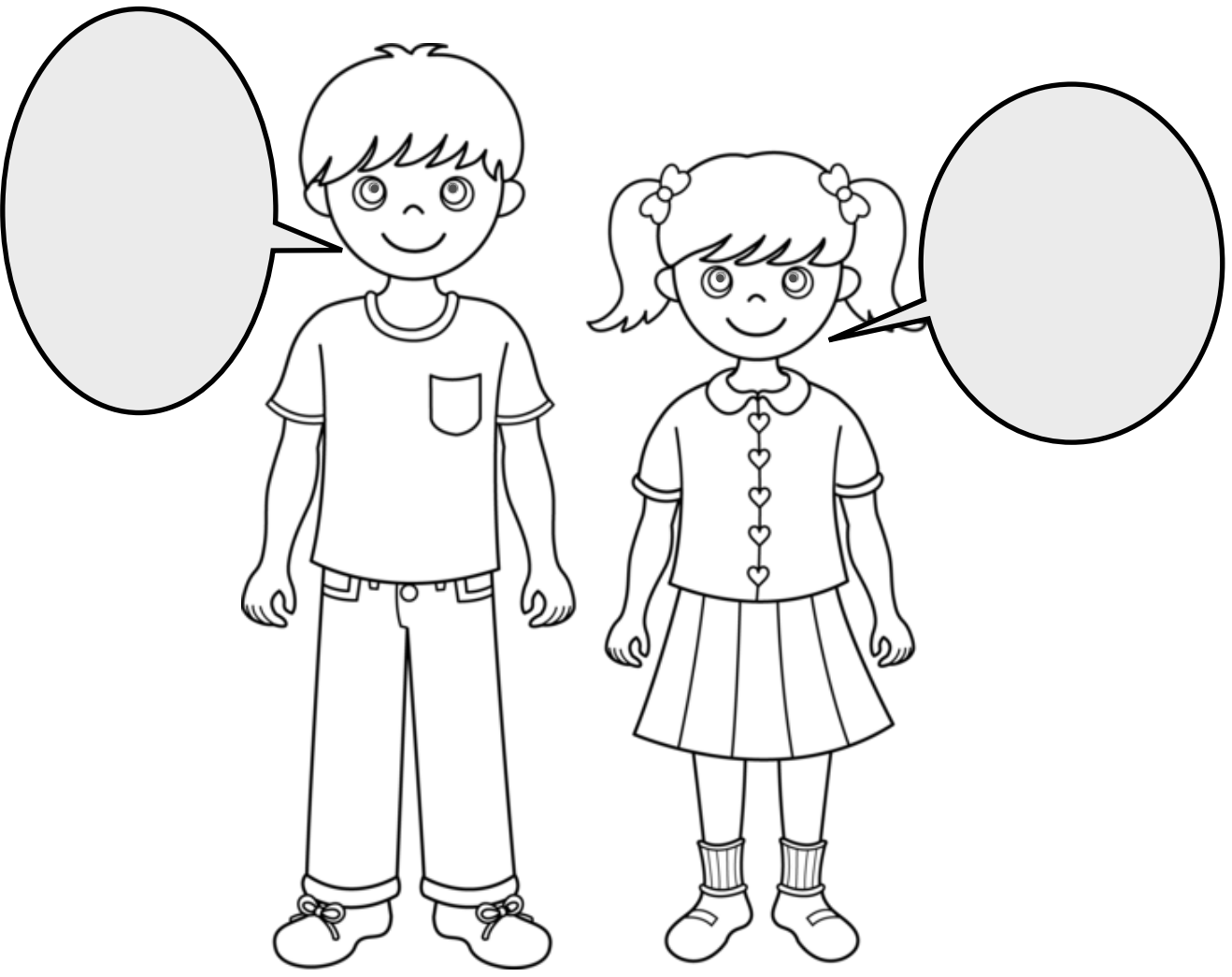
## Did'ja Know?

The saying that you're not accepted in your own hometown really is true. Often, famous speakers and movie stars mention that it's hard for them to return home.

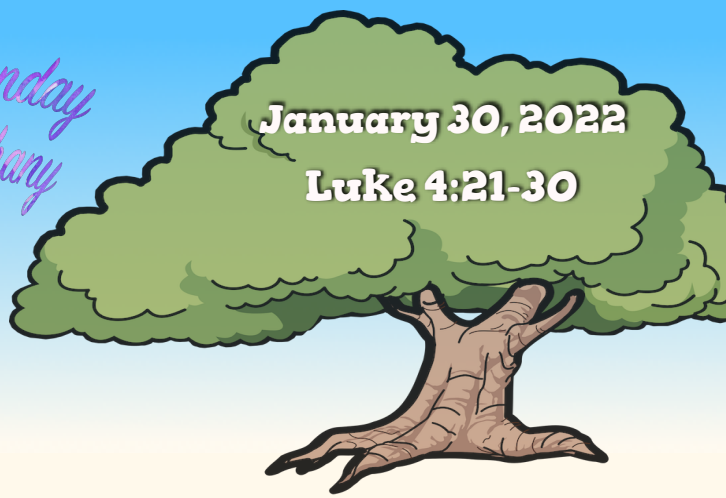


## Color That Stuff

A spoken or written statement that lays out the truth of the matter. Prophecies sometimes predict things in the future.

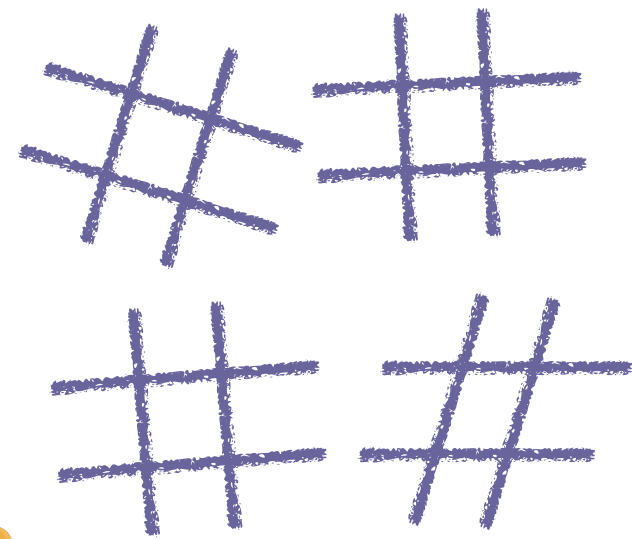


# PICTURE IT — TAKE 2
