Jesus' own people didn't always get it. But his message of love was for everyone, including Samaritans.



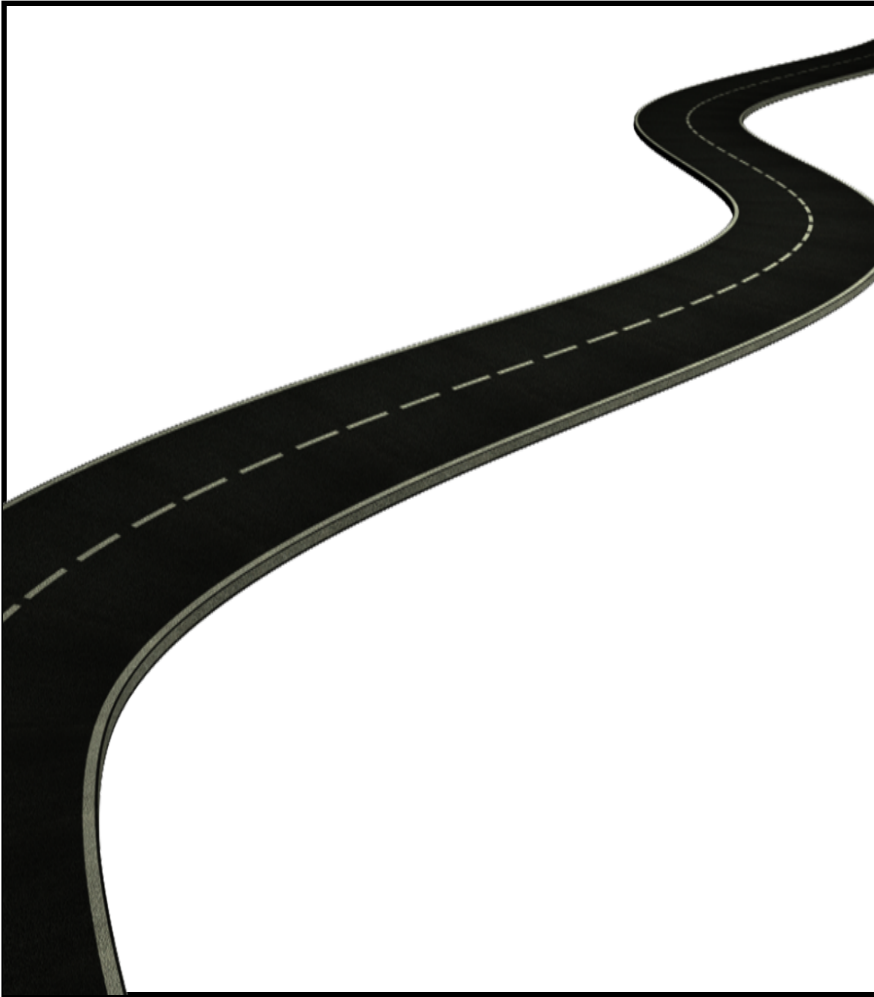
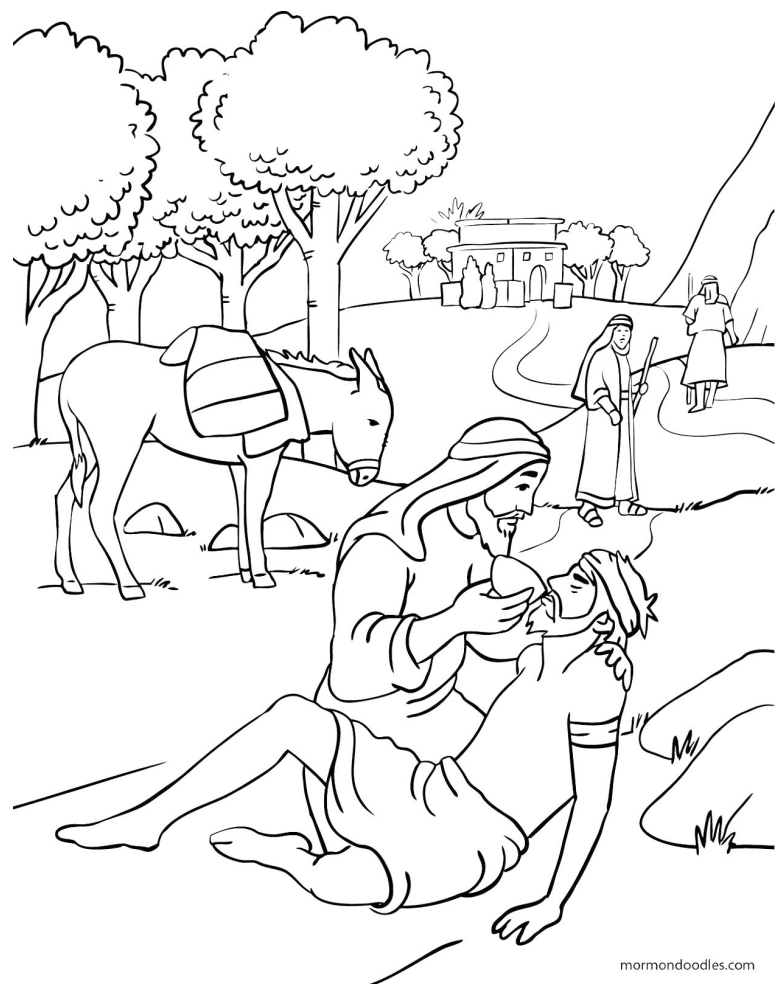
Healing

On the left is a picture of the Good Samaritan helping someone along the roadside. Draw in the right a "modern" version of this. Color them both!

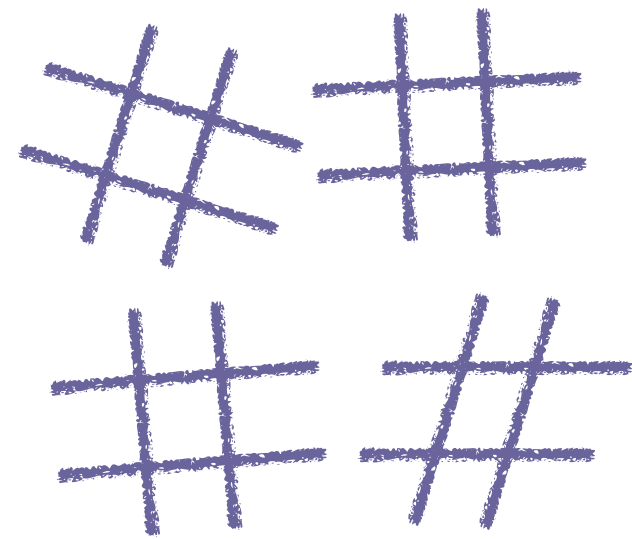


Special Task Force
