Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Light of the world, nothing can be hidden from you. Shed light on all the corners of our lives, and make us honest to bring our whole selves to you. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

(John 3:16)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

Jesus couples an ancient story of deliverance with a future vision of salvation as he and Nicodemus are engaged in a theological back-and-forth after hours.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

- What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?
- Do you prefer your actions be done in the light or in the darkness? Or: are you private or public with your thoughts, words, and actions? Why?
- For the littles: Do you like snakes? Why or why not?



Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God's love fill you with light and hope.



Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Read Numbers 21:4-9, the story of Moses lifting up the serpent in the wilderness. Consider how the analogy shapes today's story of Jesus, who came to bring the world eternal life.
