

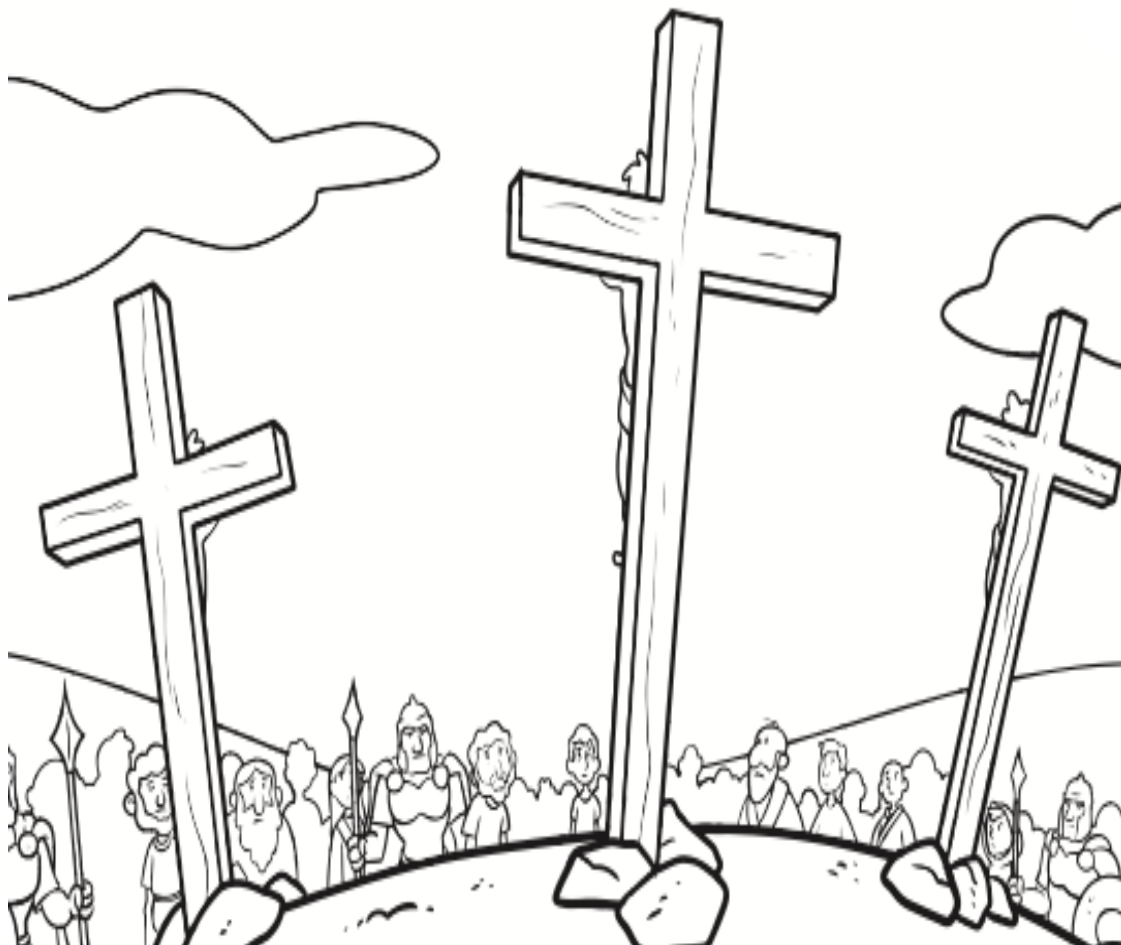


Crucifixion was a terrible death. The Romans wanted people to fear them. But Jesus would change crucifixion from something scary to something beautiful.

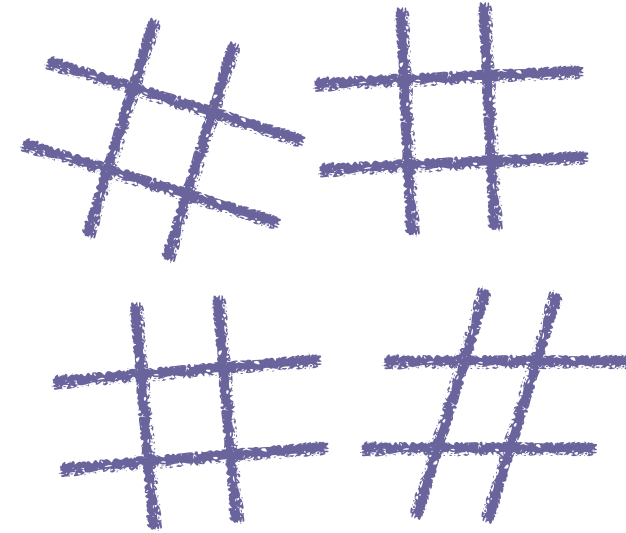
