Revisiting Ministry Priorities: (Pastor Paul)


- Pastor Paul announced that he will be retiring in one year

- Paul S. thank you to Pastor Paul, Karen, and family for contributions to the life of ILC; have strong programs and staff and we will continue moving forward



- Insurance is still a challenge but giving has been very generous

- Mulch & Ash Tree Removal
 - Fresh mulch has been applied to all parking lot islands and the center island in the front entrance courtyard.
 - A dying ash tree has been removed, was located at the east of the front entrance sidewalk.
- Ron Nemec's landscaping company completed this work.
- Memorial Trees/Landscaping
 - Stenoien memorial: Two new trees will be planted in the near future:
 - Japanese lilac tree in the Little Library area. The existing dying maple has been removed to make room for the new tree.
 - Vanilla Strawberry Hydrangea tree outside of Pastor Paul's office window. Two old shrubs will be removed to make room for the new tree.
