

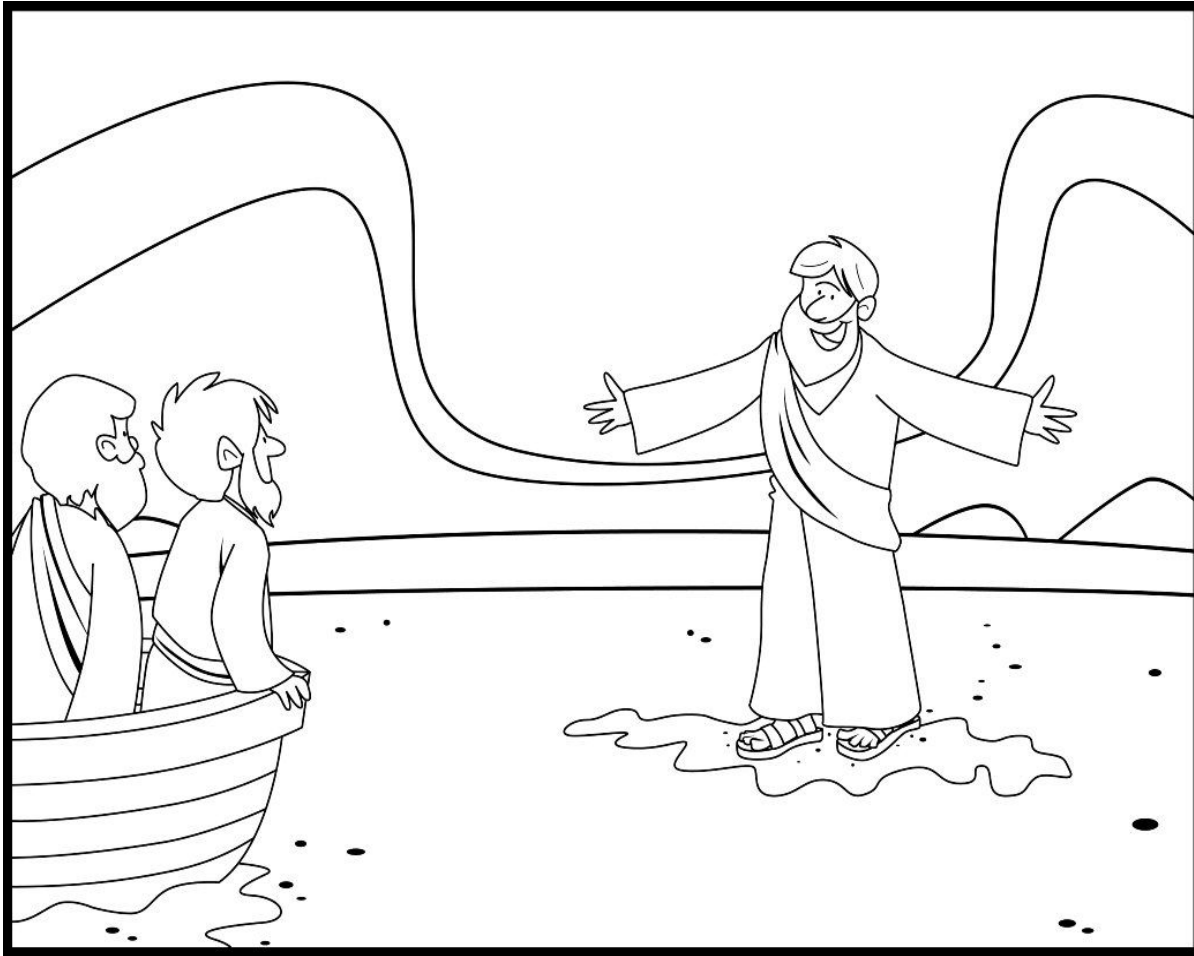


Waves are formed on a body of water mostly by the wind, but boat traffic and even the gravitational pull of the moon can influence them too.

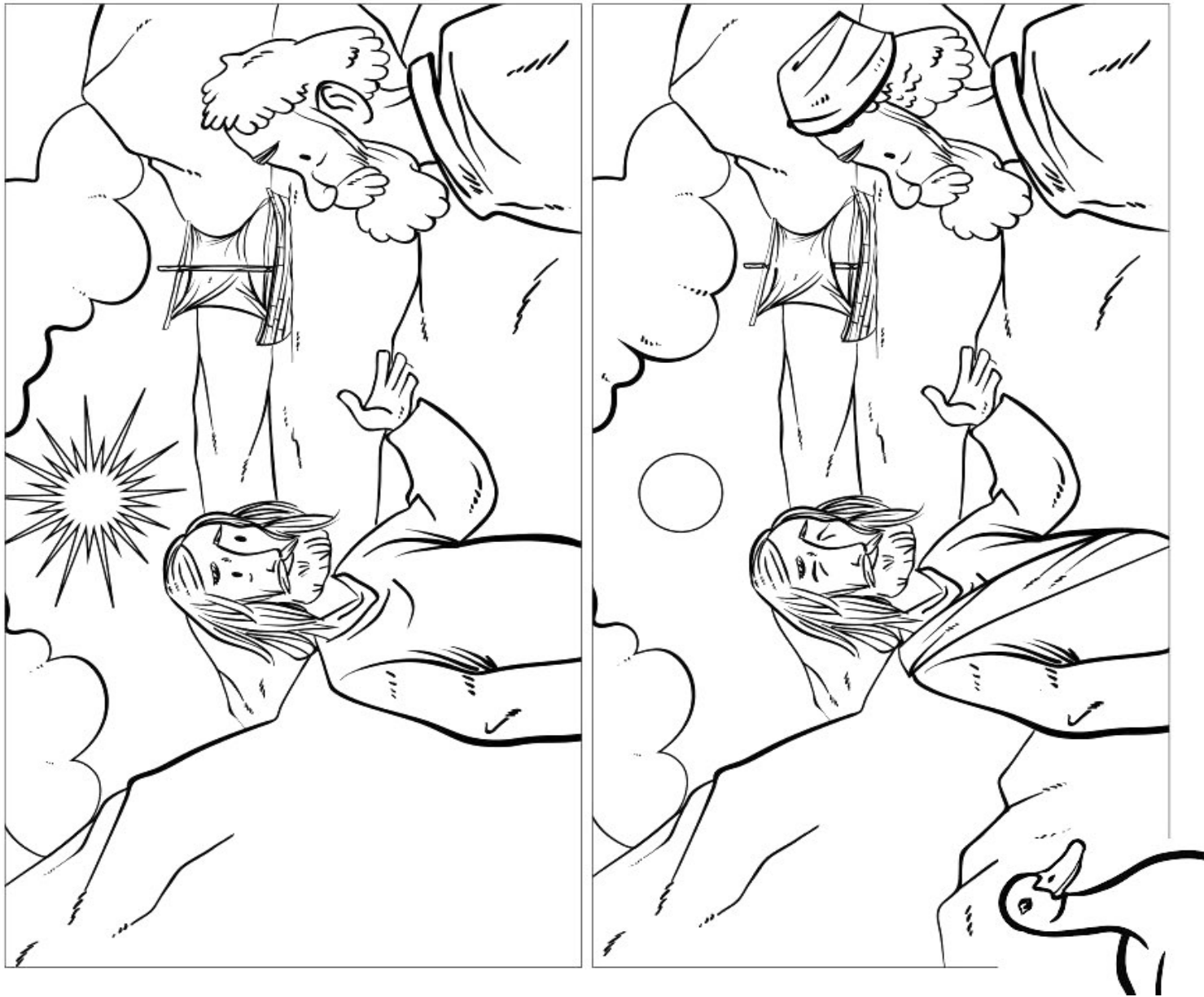


Spot the Differences

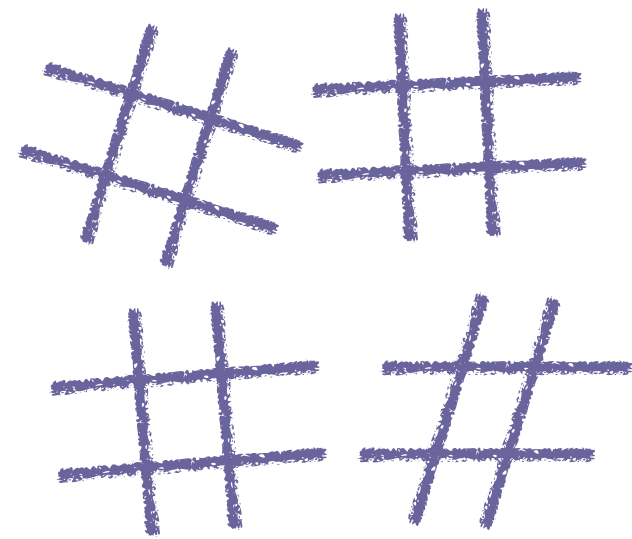
Jesus spent lots of time near the Sea of Galilee. Spot the 8 differences between the two pictures. Don't forget to rotate the page to find them all!
