Pastor Paul made a motion to approve the minutes for January 2023. Kate seconded the motion and all approved.

Financial Matters

Jennifer presented the financial information.

- Income and expenses balanced each other out for the month Both at \$102K.
- Total giving was \$20K less than last year.
- Still finetuning the budget's monthly splits. (Currently the budget is straight lined by month)
- Church Expense are less than budget in Jan due to operating without an Assoc Pastor and Savannah not being a deacon yet.
- Program expenses are above budget primarily due to one music and arts invoice (\$2.9K) for 2022 activity that
 was paid in 2023. The invoice didn't get to Kelly until mid-January which was too late to make it into 2022
 expenses. Future invoices from the vendor are now being sent directly to Kelly's attention.
- Strong month for Capital Fund receiving \$12,000.




* Church expenses are down due to Savannah not being promoted to a deacon until February and no Assoc. Pastor benefits


* Music and Worship costs were up due to a large 2022 invoice (\$2.9K) hitting the 2023 books.

Associate Pastor Call Status

- The Call Committee has met twice and also met with Pastor Craig Peterson from Minneapolis Synod.
- The Call Committee is months ahead of most call committees. The job description is done and one more meeting will be held to solidify questions for interviewing.
- Plans are to have pastor profiles by mid-March and begin to interview candidates by the end of March.
- Paul S thanked Julie M and Visioning Committee, as well as the Call Committee for all their work to date.

Committee Updates:

Properties – Mark A

- Bathroom remodel is moving forward; paint has been picked out and visited Hasting showroom to pick out Corian countertop. Sent to Beissel Renovation with a target start date of Tuesday, April 11th.
- The hot water spigot on the coffee maker was left on which damaged the cabinets below it. The countertop is fine but we will have to replace the bottom cabinets. We have asked Beissel for an estimate.
- Looking at replacing LED bulbs in the Sanctuary and Luther Hall. We are currently getting estimates for the bulbs.
 There are savings in electricity by doing this as in the past the electricity bill dropped by half. Approximately 150 bulbs in the sanctuary and 50 in Luther Hall will be replaced.
- Costs are going up. Property/Liability insurance increased from \$9,000 to \$11,000. Excel jumped 38% from last Jan/Feb to this Jan/Feb.

Middle School - Jolene T

- There will be a breakfast this Sunday from 8:15 a.m. 10.30 a.m. with a silent auction being held.
- The recessional offering at the worship services will be for the youth scholarship fund and the worship held will be led by Holy Commotion and the Youth band and Cornerstone choir.
- Thirteen students from middle school signed up for the mission trip to Duluth scheduled for July 30 August 4th. There are also 10 students signed up from Sr. High for June 17 23rd.
- With Lent beginning next week, the start time for confirmation has been moved up to 6:00 p.m. so students can
 attend the 7:00 service.
- Joe Davis has been booked to work with the Confirmation students on March 15th before he preaches at the worship services on the evening of the 15th. The Topic is "Naming your sin."

Senior High – Kate/Phil

- We are in desperate need of donations and people to participate in Saturday and Sunday for setup, cooking and cleanup. There is a need for 5-10 students on Saturday, 10-12 students for the morning shift and 10-12 students for the late morning shift on Sunday.
- There are still a lot of post it notes for food items that need to be donated.
- We have about 30 auction items.
- We will have student speakers on Sunday as part of Youth Rejoice.
