Secretary's Report - Karen Travis

• Sharon motioned to approve November minutes. Lindy seconded. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report - Rick Harrison

No report.

Treasurer's Report - Brian Nichols

- Overall we're ahead of plan.
- Five for Fifty November contributions were \$22,000, so we were able to increase contributions to the building fund ahead of plan.
- Reviewed 2013 budget. Elected to keep 2013 plan consistent with 2012 projection (\$32,000 more than 2012 plan). Thrivent Choice may be going away, so may not be able to count on \$6,000 that is currently included in proposed budget.
 - Staff: Personnel costs are based on existing staff.
 - Office Supplies: Underestimated office supplies in 2012. Group agreed the estimated expense for 2013 may be a bit high.
 - Property: Utilities are down a bit from last year. Group agreed this may need to be raised to 2011 levels.
 - Committee Expenses: Brian asked Council to ensure submissions are correct.
 - o Evangelism adopted Communications expenses, so that budget increased.
 - Nothing is specifically included for Visioning expenses for 2013.
 - Current budget proposal assumes a surplus at the end of 2012.
- Budget approval will take place at the January Annual Meeting.

Vice President's Report - Lee Prinkkila

- Next Tuesday a special committee will meet to discuss an employee handbook.
- Food committee will meet January 7th and submit recommendations for review.

Evangelism Committee - Mike Berdahl

- Alpha is coming January 10 at 6 p.m.. Mike spoke about his Alpha experience. Starts with a celebration dinner, then lessons at 6:30 p.m. and small group sessions from 7 to 8 p.m. Childcare will be provided. Official program starts Thursday, January 17.
- Still seeking new members, and struggling a bit with Meet and Greet sign-ups.
- Discussed online sign-up and how effective it is. Need to send reminders to drive people online. MaryKay is training Welcome Center people on the laptop to help those who want to sign up for volunteer opportunities online.



Immanuel Lutheran 3 Year Attendance Comparison




