# **Committee Reports:**

#### Middle School Youth – Shannon Fleck and Mary Hovet

- Youth Rejoice event: February 25 at 5:30 p.m.
- Thinking of tabling Redeemer kids working at the event.
- Main coordinator for Youth Rejoice is Carrie Determan.
- Will put the extra Happenings books on the auction table.
- Martin is checking with the tech team about what's involved in creating tent cards. It's fun for the confirmation kids.
- There are fun events planned for a variety of ages; all are encouraged to attend.

# Social Concerns – Sharon Peterson (Handout A)

- Total spending: \$214,650
- We take 20% of the first three categories of income (weekly offerings, loose offerings and special offerings). Approximately13% goes to the ELCA: \$138,710 (number is listed incorrectly on the handout).
- Budget is divided "above" and "below" the line. Please note (from handout):
  - Caring Ministry pulled out and put into other programs (Bill Hawkins)

- Have taken A Brighter Day House off the list
- Council Directed should be \$2,453 (listed incorrectly on handout)
- Social Ministries number should be \$2,015 (listed incorrectly on handout)
- Immanuel's annual giving is actually more than 20% because we give in many other ways outside the Social Ministry.

#### Senior High Youth – Amy Manicor and Vickie Olson

- Youth Rejoice: Tickets are now available on the Immanuel website
- 30-hour Famine: March 16 -17
- Lutsen Ski Trip: March 9-11.
- TEC (Teams Encounter Christ) was hosted at Immanuel recently.
- Social Justice Retreat: March 9-11 (weekend retreat at Camp Friendship) looking for groups of 12 people to go (adults and youth). For more information, see Amy or Vicki. Open to high school youth and young adults.
- U of M Junior and Senior Gathering (U Belong) Held in partnership with several local youth directors, focusing on moving from high school to college. Not just for those going to the U. Hosted at Grace University Lutheran Church at the University of Minnesota.
- Mission Trip (Cass Lake, MN): All 32 spots have been filled. There may be more openings depending on Youth Works.
- Tossing around options to get more youth bible studies or other activities started. Nothing finalized yet, but leaning toward a Senior High bible study on Sunday mornings at 11 a.m.

#### Fellowship Committee – Lindy Fischer and Terri Tomlinson

• Annual meeting went well. Nothing new to report.

#### Children's Education – Lisa Anderson and Eldri Johnson

- Planning is underway for Pioneer Camp and Explore Week.
- Vacation Bible School: Information to come.
- Organizing a service event for 4-6<sup>th</sup> graders (dates not set yet).
- Encouraging people to get registered for summer camps.
- Participants in Youth Rejoice and will be involving Children's Ministry.

#### Stewardship – Paul Stordahl

- Working on getting pledges in (have \$825,000 in pledges so far for next year, against a goal of \$900,000).
- Continuing to invite people to make contributions to the Five for Fifty campaign.

#### Adult Faith Formation – Lorraine Maenke

- Celebration of Marriage Dinner: February 11 120 signed up.
- Asking for volunteers for the next Crossroads event (on grand parenting).
- Having conversations about long-range planning for next year (Pastor Paul).
- During Lent there will be Adult Education (Wednesday nights), studying gospel text for the next Sunday.

#### **Properties – John Melchert**

- Will have a meeting this month.
- Dory Kolber's stained glass design was approved. This will be located above the other door to the Sanctuary.
- New signage is being considered
- The Library Committee is purchasing a new table for check-in and checkout.
- We have purchased new furniture and a desk for MaryKay.
- Met with the Fellowship Committee last Wednesday and they expressed concerns about the kitchen. We will be putting a formal plan in place to clean it and maintain it.

### Evangelism Committee – Mike Berdahl

- Christmas Follow-up: Considering adding another afternoon service (2 p.m., 3:30 p.m., 5 p.m., 9 p.m., and 11 p.m.), to accommodate more people.
- Discussed the possibility of adding another exit in the parking lot. Question raised about whether the city might add a turn lane to facilitate traffic flow?
- Easter is coming and we'll have traditional services. We will be passing out Easter eggs a couple weeks before containing service information, as part of our effort to encourage people to invite others to attend.
- Meet and Greet is going well.
- A decision was made not to do a community mailing for the tent meeting due to cost. Instead, we will explore other ways of getting the word out.

#### Worship, Music and Arts – Chip Carlson

- Committee meeting is next week.
- New music director for the 11 a.m. service is on board, as of February 1. She's exceeding expectations. She's highly qualified and it's great to have someone with such great background join us.
- Besides that, all our musical groups are doing well.

#### Treasurer's Report – Brian Nichols (Handout B)

- Shared Financial Summary for January with the group (details in handout).
- We exceeded our January budget (budget: \$81,485; actual: \$103,744), which puts us above plan. This is the best January we've ever had, and last year was the second best January we've ever had. Very encouraging.
- Expenses were consistent with the plan, and program expenses were half of plan.
- Benevolence to ELCA given quarterly.
- As long as giving exceeds 8.33%, we're in good shape.
- Broke benevolence down quarterly.
- Bill Hawkins did an 8-year study to calculate income by month and applied it to the budget.
- Decision was made by the Executive Committee today to make a \$100,000 payment toward the mortgage principle. When considering the amount of mortgage paid down last year and this year (at 6% interest), this means almost \$20,000 annual interest savings.

#### Financial Secretary's Report – Rick Harrison

• Not present during this portion of the meeting (unable to report).

#### Vice President's Report – Lee Prinkkila

• Lee will be talking to a colleague about what interest rate we could get by refinancing; Brian will talk to Bremer Bank and Thrivent. We will be weighing the cost of refinancing against the money that could be saved, before making any decisions to refinance the mortgage.

# Staff Reports:

#### **Bill Hawkins**

- Bremer Bank would like to donate 16 chairs to Immanuel from their lobby area. If everyone's in favor, can use them in the library. Downside is storage (sometimes the room needs to be emptied for various events).
- Spent most of the day today putting in budget numbers.
- ELCA report was finished today and delivered to MaryKay. Each year we do this report showing baptisms, deaths, etc. Due February 15.
- We will be providing new office furniture for MaryKay in the next week or two.
- Reminders for Council members:
  - Check your mailboxes!
  - Bills are paid on the 15<sup>th</sup>; let Bill know ASAP if money is owed.

# **Pastor Susan**

- Immanuel requested 35 spots at Holden Village over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. The request was confirmed and there are no additional spots available.
- Enjoying working with families preparing for baptism.
- Women's Retreat: Last weekend in February. Excited for the event and think we'll all enjoy it. It's the same day as Youth Rejoice, but people will be encourage to attend Youth Rejoice following the retreat. The event goes from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Mount Olivet Retreat Center. Cost is \$35.
- The Synod assembly is scheduled for next weekend at the Shepard of the Lake in Prior Lake. We will be electing a new bishop who will serve for at least the next six years.
- Social ministry: We have spots for Feed my Starving Children on March 17 (open to everyone).
- Pastor Susan will be participating in a two-year spiritual development-training program twice a month, focusing on what it means to live in a spiritual relationship with God.

#### Pastor Paul

- Thanks to all of those on the Council for stepping up to new roles at the church.
- We've had a great men's ministry there were 13 of us at bible study last Thursday.
- Lots of interest in both Big Horn camps (backpacking and base camp photography)
- For Lent, we're having members of the congregation tell faith stories. Lorraine will be one of them. We began doing this a couple years ago as a way to continue to focus the work we do as a church on discipleship and helping people live out their faith in daily life.
- Pastor Paul is pursuing a doctorate for ministry in leadership. As part of his studies, he will be working on a long-range planning project.
  - In the next year we'll invite our congregation to be part of renewing God's purpose for Immanuel.
  - Great opportunity to understand our three-fold ministry.
  - Missions are traditionally seen as taking place far away, but we don't live in that world anymore. We live in a community where two-thirds of the people don't go to church. We need to reach out to those, and also to people in our congregation who need to take the next step. We need to recommit to the sense that all of what we do as a church is about training missionaries. How do we engage and equip people for that?
  - Next fall we'll be inviting the congregation and the community to share in this process: What God is doing in the world and in our lives, and where he is leading us as a church.

#### President's Update – John Urbanski

- The Council retreat will be March 24. If you have shared committees try and get at least one to come, if possible. The time will be approximately 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Details to follow. We'll be handing out a binder with information on how Council works, etc.
