Secretary's Report - Karen Travis

Approved February Church Council meeting minutes.

Treasurer's Report – Brian Nichols (Handouts A and B)

- Income Report:
 - February 2012 giving was very close to the previous year; on plan at \$78,018. Revenue in March tends to be higher because of the Easter holiday. Attendance was also higher for February.
- Financial Analysis:
 - o In addition to giving, church expenses are slightly over last year.
 - While church expenses are slightly over, plan program expenses are under plan, therefore total expenses are just under plan.
 - Year to date, we are ahead of plan by \$29,000. Benevolence payments to ELCA are done quarterly (accrual noted on handout, consistent with budget).
 - Five for Fifty February contributions were \$17,000, slightly higher than Immanuel's mortgage payment.
 - Principal payment in February brought the principal down, meeting our target of having four to six times our monthly mortgage payment in the fund.

- Mortgage Update:
 - Recapped previous discussions regarding refinancing the mortgage, in order to get a lower rate and lower minimum payments that provide greater financial flexibility.
 - The application has been submitted to Thrivent and being processed (60 to 90 days), and will require the signature of two Immanuel officers.
 - o Immanuel's monthly payment will go from \$16,000 to \$11,000.

Vice President's Report - Lee Prinkkila

No report.

Adult Faith Formation – Lorraine Maenke

- Working on grand parenting/aunts/uncles program; main speaker will be Marilyn Sharp. Ten or eleven people have volunteered to be on the committee, and are brainstorming topic ideas.
- The event will be held April 21 from 8:30 a.m. to noon. Will be getting information out soon; sign-up starts a week from Sunday. Charging \$10 per person and \$15 per couple.
- An article promoting the event will appear in "Luther's Way" and other publications (e.g., Senior Center newsletter).

Worship, Music and Arts - Chip Carlson

- Committee met last night. Kids choirs have been very active.
- Having a "bring a friend to choir" event in April.
- Working on Easter program. Epiphany choir planning an event on Saturday.
 Ascension choir is getting ready for Easter, as well as an annual trip to Duluth. Both will wrap-up on May 9.
- Servant Song is going well. New contemporary worship music leader combined the two groups that had existed before.
- Adult choir is going well, though the numbers are down a bit.
- Trying to pull in more youth (e.g., junior and senior high school students).
- There will be another speaker added to improve the audio in the Sanctuary.

Properties – John Melchert

- Kitchen cleaning and maintenance:
 - Church Lady Law: Removes the typical Health Department requirement for places of worship and requires us to have a designated trainer for use of kitchen facilities. Pat Fish does this type of training for Immanuel. There are also PowerPoint presentations available.
 - There was some discussion about whether this falls under Properties, and Lee offered to take it on as a special committee, working with Fellowship.
 - Cleaning: The kitchen isn't on a regular cleaning schedule at this time. Discussed various solutions, and are looking into getting a steam cleaner for the church to own and use to clean the kitchen and other areas.
 - Maintenance: Rich prepared all the existing kitchen manuals, so will help determine the important components for maintaining and cleaning the equipment (e.g., putting together an instructional binder). Will put a program into place (such as "adopt an appliance") to do whatever cleaning and maintenance is required. Will also like to identify a champion for each piece of equipment to make sure they're cleaned properly.
- John shared a color printout of the stained glass design for the Sanctuary. As long as there are no objections, they can begin production. Cost: All is coming out of memorial funds, so there is no need to allocate any additional money to cover costs.
- Spring Clean-up Day: May 19. Might be a wedding that day; John will confirm and publicize the event.

- Signage: Will be making a list of all the signs that are needed inside the building.
 Over time, all signage needs should be addressed and design will be uniform throughout.
- Room B will be turned into a prayer room using Memorial money. Bill is helping to organize renovations.
- Rich determined that steam cleaning, rather than sealing, is recommended for the kitchen floor.

Senior High and Middle School Youth – Amy Manicor and Vickie Olson; Shannon Fleck and Mary Hovet

- Youth Rejoice was a huge success. Had 23 less students working this year than last year, so they are making a large amount for their work, prompting discussion about how best to allocate income. The group chose not to cap income earned.
- Afton Ski Day in January included 15 people and was a big success.
- 30-hour Famine: March 16 -17. There are 15-20 students signed up to go. Need more to chaperone. It's at Immanuel (overnight). People can donate online.
- Easter Breakfast: A full meal will be served. Need volunteers and people to donate food
- Holy Commotion: Last Monday of each month starting at 6 p.m. (everyone is welcome, all ages).
- Youth Quake: March 23-25. A small group from Immanuel is going to participate.
- Lutsen Ski Trip was last weekend and was a success.
- Mission Trip for June: 34 spots have been reserved and filled.
- Sunday Bible Study for youth (held on Sundays at 11 a.m.).

- Newspaper ad is ready. Will be looking at a special ad for Easter.
- New member class included 24 adults and 6 kids. Exploring what we could be doing with follow-up (particularly for repeat visitors) to get them to join.
- Need more people for Meet and Greet. Considering focusing only on the front door as the welcoming center for new visitors (rather than try to also cover side doors).

- Southwest Grief Coalition, spring series starts April 12 at United Methodist Church.


- Number of Sundays in February: 4 in both 2012 and 2011.
