Secretary's Report – Gay Ludvig

• Review and approve April Minutes

President's Report – John Urbanski

- Constitution and Bylaws task force update
 - The task force will continue to meet this summer and compare the ELCA Constitution with Immanuel's Constitution and bring back their recommendations this fall to the Council.
- Same gender marriage: There will be an article in the June/July of Luther's Way describing where Immanuel's been, why we're doing this, and possible ways to arrive at a decision. The last two sessions this spring were well attended, and there were several suggestions as to the next steps for Immanuel's congregation. John recommended a task force meet this summer to discuss how Immanuel will decide the same gender marriage issue. Will there be a straw ballot, will the Council gather the ballots and give a recommendation from the results, and when might a decision be made?

- Families Moving Forward / Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative
 - The church has agreed to host homeless families three times: June 29-July 6, the last week of September, and during Christmas week. Sharon went to the luncheon explaining the program and she said her son volunteered to sleep over night during the times the homeless families would be at Immanuel. Martin said that 75-80 % of supplies are being donated, and Kim is very optimistic that the program will be very successful. Paul stated that his wife's home church which was involved in the Collaborative spent money on showers at the church so the people wouldn't have to wait until they returned to the shelter.

Vice President's Report - Susan Geitzenauer

Financial Secretary's Report – Bob Warner

- Giving in April was 7.6 % more than last year, and the YTD giving was 11.1% more than 2013.
- Attendance was greater in 2014 than 2013.

Treasurer's Report- Brian Nichols

- Expenses/Financial Reports
- Church expenses were slightly over budget in April, and over \$10,000 higher than budget YTD. Paid out over \$50,000 for ELCA and Social Ministry benevolence in April. Received \$28,166 in contributions for 5 for 50 campaign. It's usually \$20,000.

Committee Reports:

Children's Ministry – Lisa

- Families First Carnival will be this Friday, May 16 from 5:30-7:30 p.m. Bingo, a Bounce House, concessions and a photo booth are a few of the options being offered. There is a need for more volunteers to work the half hour shifts.
- Vacation Bible School will be held July 14-17th. Since there was a 50% drop off rate last year on Friday, it was decided that VBS would only be four days instead of 5. Children ages 3-4th grade are encouraged to enroll. Fifth and sixth graders may volunteer as helpers to the teachers. The curriculum is "Gangway to Galilee."

Adult Faith Formation – Lorraine Maenke

- The men's cribbage tournament raised \$3200 for Simpson House.
- The men's softball game is this Thursday, May 15th at Round Lake at 7:50 p.m.
- Women's Service Day is this Sat. May 17th from 9:00-2:00 p.m. They will be making pillowcase dresses and tying fleece blankets for children at Camp Noah.
- The Faith Formation group met to discuss what topics should be presented on Wed. evenings. Some ideas included retirement, mental health, spirituality and parenting. Sessions might vary in length. Some would be one night and others would be three. The question was raised: "How do we measure people's growing faith?" Also, "How do we focus from program development to people development?"

Worship, Music and Arts – Janis Cameron

- The Epiphany Choir sang at the earlier church service, and they will be singing one Sunday every month this summer.
- Servant Song will continue.
- Gary is working on the theme for this fall.
- Smaller choirs might sing at Elim Shores as the residents enjoy hearing them.

Properties – Brian Heinzen

- The cleanup of the church grounds last Sat. had an OK turnout. We need more mulch by the front entrance.
- The lighting on the cross in the sanctuary needs to be adjusted.

Senior High and Middle School Youth - Kirsten and Donna

- The Easter Breakfast Fundraiser earned more this year than last. Students were paid \$14.00 per hour and the cleanup crew was paid time-and-a-half.
- The garage sale on May 3rd made slightly less than last year. They raised \$4400.00. Twenty percent of that money went to Simpson House and 80 % went in student funds. The rest of the money was donated.
- There may be a fundraiser run for 2015.
- Confirmation is done on May 14th.
- The Youth Works Mission trip will poll parents to get feedback as to why few students signed up to go.
- Middle School attendance is way down this year for Camp Onomia.

Social Concerns – Sharon Peterson

- Immanuel participated in Minnesota March Food Share for Prop.
- There is a bookshelf in Prop where people may take one book when they frequent the store. There have been 300 books taken since Oct. 16th.
- Back to school supplies distribution will begin on Aug. 13th.
- Four Twins' tickets were donated to Rezek House participants.
- There were 65 people who attended the Feed My Starving Children event.
- There will be a cleanup at Round Lake on Sept. 6-7th.






