Secretary's Report - Gay Ludvig

• Review and approve July minutes. Pastor Susan moved to approve the July minutes. Christy seconded it. The motion carried.

New Business: Congregation Survey/ Kairos/ Core Values August 18th meeting

President Report: John

• Response from Synod re Constitution changes - update

The Synod approved of Immanuel's Constitutional changes except for the 120 day deadline. The Synod did not want to be held to that deadline. The question remains: "Does Immanuel adopt the model language without the 120 days?"

Child Protection Policy

The Children's Education Committee recommended that Immanuel accept the policy that Cindy Paulson had used in her former church. Eldri, who is a lawyer, went through the document and thought the policy was very good. Eldri recommended that Immanuel adopt the policy. Eldri will set the final copy on the website for the congregation to view. Paul Stordahl made the motion to adopt the policy, and Sharon Peterson seconded it. The motion carried.

Call Committee - update

The Call Committee held a second interview with a candidate August 10th and is performing reference checks. The Call Committee interviewed two candidates over the past two weeks and has received profiles for additional candidates. One of the candidates that was interviewed took herself out of the running as she was pursuing a full-time call, not a part-time one. The Minneapolis Area Synod office has been in communication with additional candidates that are interested in Immanuel's position. These candidates are completing the paperwork which may be passed to the Call Committee for their review. Please keep the Call Committee, the Minneapolis Area Synod and the candidates who are considering the part-time position in one's prayers.

• India Navrati/Dandiya Festival request- October 16th

Shilpa Sastri wants to host his religious Navratri/Dandiya Festival in Luther Hall on Friday, October 16th. He wants the room from 6:00-11:00 p.m. There will be 150 people there, and Shilpa wants 10 rectangle tables, 1 round table and about 100 chairs. He will cater the food from outside the church and serve it in the church. He would pay the \$75.00 custodian fee and also give a donation to Immanuel. Since this is a religious festival, which conflicts with the ELCA's policies; they worship many Gods, Scott Sabin made a motion to deny the request. Bob Peterson seconded the motion, and the motion carried with one abstention. John will contact Shilpa to tell him that we deny his request for Immanuel's facilities.

Vice President's Report - Brenda

Personnel Committee -update

Brenda and Jana Cinnamon met and made many revisions to the Employee Guidebook. The Personnel Committee will meet again in August.

Financial Secretary's Report - Scott Belseth

- Actual giving 2015 vs. 2014
 - July giving: \$21,496 (34.1%) more than 2014 (\$84,599 vs.\$63,103)
 - 2015 giving: Year-to-date \$3,601 (0.6%) less than 2014 (\$605,520 vs. (\$609,121)
- Actual giving vs. budget:
 - July giving: \$8,851 (11.7%) more than budget (\$84,599 vs.\$75,748 budgeted)
 - 2015 giving: Year-to-date \$812 (0.1%) less than budget (\$605,520 vs. \$606,332)
- Attendance: Sundays in July 2015 (4) July 2014 (4)

Treasurer's report Brian Nichols Expenses/Financial Reports:

· Highlights of the Financial Summary:

- Giving was almost \$9,000 over budget for the month of July and remains less than \$1,000 below budget YTD
- Church expenses were on budget for the month but remain \$12,000 over budget YTD
- Paid out almost \$50,000 in Benevolence in July
- Received \$18,548 in 5 for 50 contributions. Building fund balance less than \$30,000 or below 2 times the minimum monthly mortgage payment

Staff salary adjustment update Brian

In July Immanuel was back to their budget, but there is no surplus at this point.
Bob Peterson recommended that staff salaries be prioritized for the 2016 budget
year. He mentioned that if there is a surplus at the end of 2015, that a one-time
bonus be give to the staff. Paul Stordahl made a motion that there be no increase
in staff salaries for 2015, but there should be a budget prioritization for staff salary
increases for 2016. Scott Sabin seconded it, and the motion carried.

Committee Reports:

• Children's Ministry - .Eldri

The committee hasn't met recently. Vacation Bible School had twice as many children this year than it did last year. There were more volunteers as well. It was a huge success!

Senior High Youth- Scott Sabin and Jolene Held

The Senior High Youth Committee will meet next week. Pool parties for 7th, 8th and 9th graders will be held this August. There will be a 'Student Leader Training on Saturday, August 22nd at 9:00 a.m. The confirmation guides will meet on Monday, August 24th at 5:30 p.m. and also on Wednesday, August 25th at 7:00 p.m. The confirmation retreat will be on Nov. 13-15th. Their committee is looking at different mission work. This year the students went to the Cheyenne River Reservation in South Dakota for a week. Jolene said they are hoping to help the homeless worldwide.

Worship, Music and Arts – Bob Peterson

There will be no meeting this month. Bob will present information at the Sept. 8th Council Meeting.

• Parish Fellowship Co-Chair - Melanie

She and her committee are ready for fall. She and Alecia will meet next week.

Properties – Brian Heinzen was absent.

Stewardship – Paul Stordahl

His committee hasn't met. However, Pastor Paul and he sent an e-mail to the congregation on July 16th describing the different ways for Immanuel members to submit their gifts, that are alternatives to the weekly offering basket, since so many people are out-of-town during the summer months. The letter described Simply Giving, Online transactions, and Stock or Mutual Fund donations. They also discussed placing Simply Giving cards in the envelope containers on the back of the chairs in the sanctuary for those who feel awkward not physically placing anything in the offering basket.

Social Concerns – Sharon Peterson

On Welcome Sunday, Sept. 13th, Sharon is requesting that members bring personal hygiene items to be divided among three organizations: Cornerstone: diapers, baby wipes, baby shampoo, baby wash and baby lotion Rezek House/LSS Metro Homeless Youth Services: laundry detergent, dryer sheets, household cleaners and cleaning supplies PROP and the PROP Shop: new socks and underwear in all sizes, children and adults.

Pastor Susan's furniture is in place. The custodian service that Immanuel uses on Sundays has been great. In Sept. the custodian will be used more. Presently, the custodian arrives at 7:30 a.m. and leaves about noon.

There are 40 members of Immanuel who will complete a survey at the end of August. There will be a review of the results at that time.
