

This week's Bible story is

Holy Week

from Luke 19:28, 40: 22:14

Passion/Palm Sunday

from Luke 19:28-40; 22:14-23:56.

Joy and sadness are woven together in Jesus' life and death.

Ask each other what you remember about:

- Parade
- Palm Branches
- Crowds
- Crown of Thorns
- Cross
- Jesus

Death by crucifixion sometimes took days. The Romans put crosses in public places like roadsides. They left people to die as a reminder to others.

Family Conversations

- 1 Tell about a parade you have seen.
- What is the joyful part of this story? What is the sad part?
- **3** Look in your Spark Story Bible. Are there other parts that belong to the story of Holy Week?
- Find a small cross that is easy to hold. Use it to retell this story together. Have one person start by holding the cross and telling the story of the Palm Sunday parade. Stop part way into the story and pass the cross to someone else. Continue the story before passing the cross again. Keep going until you've told the whole story of Holy Week.
