Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.




Pray: Light a candle. Open your devotion with prayer.

Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

Jesus answered, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these." (John 1:50)



Nathanael was impressed with Jesus for having a vision of him sitting beneath a fig tree. Jesus promised there would be far greater things to see than that!



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household or community.

For the littles: What is your favorite fruit to eat?

Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.
