Pray: Light a candle. Open your devotion with prayer.

Merciful God, your will is to save, not to condemn. Lead us to an ever-deeper experience of living in your grace, that others might see and know you through our witness, for the sake of Jesus. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. (John 3:16)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

God sent Jesus so that as we reside in him, we might also believe.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household or community.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

Do you prefer your actions be done in the light or in the darkness?

Or: are you private or public with your thoughts, words, and actions? Why?

For the littles: Do you like snakes? Why or why not?



Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God grant you eternal life. Amen.



Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Read Numbers 21:4-9, the story of Moses lifting up the serpent in the wilderness. Consider how the analogy shapes today's story of Jesus, who came to bring the world eternal life.
