Pray: Light a candle. Open your devotion with prayer.

Read: Read the key verses from Sunday's reading.

⁹Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he too is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost." (Luke 18:9-10)



Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem when he stopped to mend a torn Israel by welcoming the sinner, Zacchaeus, back into the fold.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household or community.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

Are there things you've done in your life that you feel are unforgivable? Are there things you feel you could and should make restitution for?

For the littles: When you're sorry for something you've done, how can you show it?

Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.
