Pray: Light a candle. Open your devotion with prayer.

Generous God, you give us life abundant, far beyond our imagining. May we never neglect to offer thanksgiving for all we have received, especially in the gift of your son Jesus Christ. Amen.



Read: Read the key verses from Sunday's reading.

¹⁷Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? ¹⁸Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹Then he said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well." (Luke 17:17-19)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

Ten lepers were healed of their disease. Only one returned with gratitude. Only that one was "made well." Maybe wellness is more than the healing of bodily ailments.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household or community.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

Tell of something you earned because you worked hard for it. Is there also room for gratitude for the thing you got?

For the littles: What is one thing you're super grateful for?



Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God grant you gratitude. Amen.
