#### **Learning to Drive Tips (from other Immanuel parents)**

- A church parking lot is a great place to go. There are medians to circle around and places to practice starting, stopping and parking.
- Be prepared to realize JUST HOW NEW and FOREIGN driving is to your kid!
- Come with patience and be encouraging.
- This can be scary for them, but you ultimately want them to think critically and CONFIDENTLY!
- Allow plenty of time to get where you are going. You may not be used to how long it takes when traveling the speed limit!

#### **Tracking your Driving Hours**

- Road Ready app or something similar
  - o Monitors total time logged and also notes day/night time driving
  - Can email yourself a PDF of driving log in the state approved format
- Do you want to track your student's whereabouts once they have their license (GPS/speed)?

### You know your child best. What will help set them up for success?

- Some students prefer all the instructions before they begin their driving session. It can be hard for new drivers to focus on instructions coming at them quickly.
- Some students prefer to learn in the moment while others become frustrated and confused. Ask what is most helpful for your new driver.
